Attendance in school continues to be a priority and will be monitored extremely closely. If your

child is ill and will be absent from school, please telephone the school office and leave a message on the absence line from 8:15am. If further information is required, a member of the office will telephone you later in the morning.

If your child's attendance becomes a concern, you will initially receive a school letter, followed by a meeting in school with a member of the leadership team and the Educational Welfare Officer.

Term time school holidays will not be authorised, unless the holiday is deemed necessary in exceptional circumstances. If you take your child out of school you will be issued with a fine as per the local authority policy. If you have a query about the school holiday procedure, please speak to Mrs Cummings in the office.
